Clinical presentation of three cases of Giant Salivary Calculi

Abstract:

Sialolithiasis is a common disease of the major salivary glands. The majority of sialoliths occur in the submandibular gland or its duct and are a common cause of acute and chronic infections. Salivary stones may range from tiny particles to several centimetres in length. While the majorities of salivary stones are asymptomatic or cause minimal discomfort, larger stones may interfere with the flow of saliva and cause pain and swelling. We are presenting three cases affecting submandibular & parotid glands
